Marine Safety

We are fortunate to have a Marine Safety Patrol Officer visit Lake Todd several times over the summer. He puts out the safety markers in the spring and retrieves them in the fall. He also checks on licensed boats, safety equipment, and monitors the safe use of the lake.

He recently gave us a schedule for NH Marine Patrol Boating Education classes. These safe boating classes will be mandatory for younger motor boaters beginning in 2002, and mandatory for all power boat users, regardless of age, by 2008 The classes are free this year (perhaps not in the future) and may be scheduled by calling 1-888-254-2125. Taking Care of Our Lake

There will soon be a poster at the access area for outside boats on Lake Todd on Rt. 103 with the message: "TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR YOUR LAKES AND WILDLIFE." It continues, "Please use alternatives to lead fishing sinkers and jigs. Please don't leave fishing line behind. Please keep your distance from nesting loons and chicks. While enjoying this lake, please take care and help to protect wildlife by allowing them the space they need." We hope everyone follows these practices to help keep Lake Todd beautiful and thriving.

A Few Reminders . .

All types of water craft can flush loons from their shoreline nests, leaving eggs vulnerable. They can also disrupt parental care and feeding of young. Please stay at least 100 feet away from loons and other lake wildlife, even further if they show signs of fear. If you observe a loon being harassed or injured, please contact one of the following:
