Do you get batty at dusk? The bats you see zigzagging through the air at night over the lake are probably Little Brown Bats. These bats consume hundreds of mosquitos in an hour! They can detect, pursue, and capture an insect in about a second, using their wings and skin between their feet to bring a catch to their mouth while still in flight. They are not blind, but they do use echolocation to locate their prey, emitting a high frequency click and analyzing the echoes that bounce back. And no, bats don't make nests in people's hair. Bats! You've got to love them!
